AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SERVICES **BETWEEN** THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MEDICAL BRANCH AT GALVESTON AND THE COUNTY OF POLK

This agreement ('Agreement") is made by and between The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston ("UTMB") and Polk County, Texas (the "County") for the provision of medical services to the County's eligible indigent population

I Definitions - Specific terms used in this agreement are

- 1 1 Eligible Resident A County resident meeting the financial criteria outlined by the County Eligible Residents must
 - 1 1 1 Be listed on the County's approved roster provided monthly on a timely basis to UTMB, and

 - Present a valid county identification card to UTMB, and
 Have a valid referral from the County indigent health care office or a physician designated by the County indigent health care office as able to make referrals
- 1 2 Emergency Care Any injury or illness that causes serious impairment to bodily functions, serious dysfunction of any bodily organ or part, serious disfigurement and/or in the case of a pregnant woman a threat to the health of the mother or of the fetus
- 13 Primary Care General medical care that is provided by family practitioners, pediatricians, and internal medicine physicians
- 1 4 Provisional Pay Status If the patient is deemed not an Eligible Resident, then fees will be payable based upon their financial position in accordance with UTMB established criteria Services are contingent upon patient meeting UTMB's financial criteria for their particular status as it relates to the federal poverty level
- 1 5 Secondary Care Specialty medical care or service provided by a specialist who is asked to provide more insight and treatment regarding the medical problem of a patient who has been referred to UTMB
- 1 6 Tertiary Care Health care treatment and services within a sophisticated specialty care setting that is serving as a referral and support alternative to primary and secondary care
- II Eligibility - The following County residents are covered

Eligible Residents-UTMB will provide Secondary/Tertiary Care for County residents meeting the County's financial criteria and satisfying the requirements of

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Section 1 1 above UTMB will confirm a County resident's eligibility in the event the resident holds a valid card but does not appear on the monthly roster

III. Scope of Services - Each contracting party has these responsibilities

3 1 County's Responsibilities

- 3 1 1 The County agrees to pay fees in accordance with Section IV below for health care services provided to Eligible Residents within 30 days of the invoice date to the UTMB Accounting Department, P O Box 200349, Houston, Texas 77216-0349
- The County shall screen and register patients in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Indigent Health Care and Treatment Act and the County's internal procedures in advance of treatment
- 3 1 3 The County shall provide each indigent patient with a card that identifies the patient as an Eligible Resident and containing the information in the form identified in Exhibit A
- The County shall provide UTMB by the 25th of each month a list of Eligible Residents for the following month
- 3 1 5 The County agrees to refer Eligible Patients through its indigent health care office or a physician designated by the County indigent health care office as able to make referrals
- 3 1 6 The County agrees to complete the UTMB referral form as identified in Exhibit B in advance in order to authorize treatment for all Eligible Residents
- The County shall identify specific indigent health care officials who can make referrals and confirm Eligible Resident status, including the name, address and phone numbers of County officials for telephone eligibility verification and patient referral
- 3 1 8 The County shall be solely responsible for arranging for any followup medical care including referral form completion for Eligible Residents treated at UTMB, subject to the Texas Indigent Health Care and Treatment Act

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3.2 UTMB's responsibilities

- 3 2 1 UTMB agrees to provide a monthly invoice to the County within 60 days of treatment
- 3 2 2 UTMB only agrees to provide Specialty and Tertiary Care to Eligible Residents unless the County otherwise requests in writing
- 3 2 3 UTMB agrees to invoice the County solely for Eligible Residents referred to UTMB by the County indigent health care office or a physician designated by the County indigent health care office as able to make referrals
- 3 2 4 UTMB agrees to provide discharge summaries and consultation reports to the County's indigent health care office
- 3 2 5 UTMB agrees to refer all Eligible Residents back to the County's indigent care office for follow-up treatment of the referred condition
- 3 2 6 UTMB agrees to invoice County solely for health care services rendered to Eligible Residents holding the appropriate consultation form as identified in Exhibit B
- 3 2 7 UTMB agrees to invoice the County indigent health care office monthly for all hospital and physician services

AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SERVICES BETWEEN

THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MFDICAL BRANCH AT GALVESTON AND THE COUNTY OF POLK

The Agreement by and between The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, a component of The University of Texas System (hereinafter referred to as 'UTMB'), and Polk County, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "County"), for the provision of medical services to the County's eligible indigent population ("Agreement"), is amended as stated herein and this Amendment shall become and be made a part of the original Agreement, effective as of _______, 1999

- 1 Amend Article IV of the Agreement by inserting the following new Section 4.5
 - If a patient is unable or unwilling to pay the co-pay at the time of service or hospital admission, the County will be responsible for paying this amount on behalf of the patient through a mutually agreeable voucher system UTMB must receive the co-pay or voucher from an Eligible Resident at the time of service or hospital admission. The County shall pay 100% of the co-pay amount. Further, any amount paid under this section will not be included when computing the not-to-exceed amount of services provided, if such an amount is specified in the Agreement.
- 2 Amend Article V of the Agreement by inserting the following new Section 5.5
 - UTMB accepts payment from County for medical services provided to Eligible Residents. In the event Eligible Resident is entitled to payment for medical services from another third party or for payment for a Workers' Compensation claim or from other primary insurance coverage maintained by Eligible Resident ("third party claim"), UTMB shall make no demand from County for reimbursement to the extent it receives payment from a third party claim. In the event UTMB has received payment from County and later recovers a third party claim, UTMB shall credit County for the amount received not to exceed the amount of billed services. For purposes of accomplishing the intent of this section, County hereby assigns to UTMB its rights to collection for any third party claim for services rendered by UTMB to Eligible Residents.

All other terms and conditions as set forth in the original Agreement, and not in conflict with this Amendment, shall remain in full force and effect

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN DEEP EAST TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AND

Honorable John Thompson, Polk County Judge

I PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

The terms of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Deep East Council of Governments (DLTCOG) and Honorable John Thompson is effective for the period of August 1, 1999 until July 31, 2000

Either DETCOG or the Honorable John Thompson may propose amendments to this MOU at any time by providing written notice. To become effective, amendments shall require approval of the DETCOG Executive Director, DETCOG STAR Director, and the Honorable John Thompson

This MOU will assist DETCOG in effectively providing quality services to at-risk youths and their families DETCOG's policies stipulate that "no youth will be denied services due to refusal of the family to participate in counseling. If the family is unavailable or refuses to participate, the youth will be seen and provided counseling services at school or STAR offices. The following counties are currently provided STAR services. Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, and Trinity

II. PURPOSE

- Jointly participate in the development and implementation of Services to At-Risk Youth program "STAR" in the Deep East Texas region, including the most efficient use of the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services (TDPRS) STAR program funds TDPRS places its highest priority on keeping youths in their homes (Family Preservation) We will receive referrals from CPS workers, juvenile probation officers, and ISD'S who can refer families to STAR. These agencies will also work with the STAR program to provide training on what type of clients we can work with
- Encourage the development of mutual training activities for providers of services to youth personnel at the regional levels, with particular emphasis on prevention techniques, family crisis intervention, and enhancement of client self-determination. This can be achieved whenever there is an opportunity for cross training to assist each agency employee's understanding of the requirements for acceptance in their program.

- Coordinate case referral procedures for clients and their families to assure that the most appropriate and least restrictive service is accessible and that confidentiality is maintained
- Ensure that staff at the local level coordinate services and work together to carry out the mutual objectives of the two agencies

WHEREAS, for over a half century farmers and ranchers working in cooperation with local soil and water conservation districts (SWCDs) have built a legacy proving themselves willing and able to assume responsibility for the conservation of the states soil, water and related natural resources, and

WHEREAS, since the 1940's technical assistance provided to landowners by soil and water conscrvation districts has been provided through a partnership with the federal government through the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) formerly the Soil Conservation Service (SCS), and

WHEREAS, the reduction of funds appropriated to the USDA-NRCS over the past two decades has drastically reduced the technical assistance available from this source, and

WHEREAS federal mandated programs such as the Farm Bill, the Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act, and other environmental laws have drastically increased the workload of soil and water conservation districts and NRCS Staff, thereby reducing the time available for direct assistance to landowners for traditional conservation planning, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to continue to strengthen voluntary conservation programs to improve management and efficiency of water use and to improve quality and quantity of water available for the citizens of Texas strengthen locally led conservation programs to protect the state's soil resources, strengthen brush management programs for erosion control, water management and improvement of wildlife habitat, and strengthen voluntary conservation programs for timber stand improvement, and

WHEREAS, there are many public benefits received from SWCD programs such as the protection of local land values and local tax bases, protection of the agricultural productivity base, sustaining local economies providing watershed protection and flood control, reducing sedimentation in streams, rivers and lakes, increasing or sustaining stream flows, enhancing groundwater recharge, enhancing local municipal and industrial water supplies, improving fisheries, wetlands and aquatic systems, maintaining stability of the state's overall water budget, maintaining a healthy wildlife population, helping protect threatened and endangered species, improving air quality, providing community services through soil interpretations for agricultural and community development, and improving quality of life

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Polk County Commissioners Court actively supports seeking increased funding of the soil and water conservation program in Texas by the Texas Legislature

Urging State Supported Financial Protections for Agricultural Producers in Texas

In a regularly scheduled meeting of the Polk County Commissioners Court held on April 13, 1999, the following was considered,

The farming and ranching - the agriculture - we have today in Texas ands in the United States is unique No nation has ever had so few people actively engaged in agricultural production. This is a profound social change that has isolated most people from rural life and from an appreciation of the complexities and uncertainties of food production. For the most part, people take agricultural production for granted. Our society has had no experience with true food scarcity. Our supermarkets always have full shelves and food is cheap. Today we spend only ten percent of our income on food, whereas in 1950 we spent twenty-two percent and in 1935 a moderate income family spent 47% of their total income on food. In the past, it took much more

What do the various players, such as banking - government and agriculture need to do to succeed in a rapidly changing environment? Agriculture is a 45 billion dollar industry in Texas Agriculture is vitally important, not only to our state's food supply, but to our economic well being

WHEREAS, the past three years of unprecedented weather disasters coupled with very low commodity prices have placed our farmers and ranchers in a situation wherein they have been unable to sustain production, supply, financing or profit, and

WHEREAS, as price volatility, environmental and food safety regulation, production variability, insects, diseases, water availability (cost & quality), inability to match "price supported" foreign competition lack of lender commitment to agriculture weakening collateral values, cost of credit, property rights spiraling cost of boil weevil programs and increased machinery costs have blended together to create a situation wherein Texas Farmers and Ranchers are unable to sustain production, supply, financing or profit,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Polk County Commissioners Court supports and urges the State of Texas to adopt laws and/or policies that would accomplish the following,

- a state created program that would pay all (or a significant part) of the cost of crop insurance for a three year period commencing in the year 2000,
- immediate action by the state to insulate local producers from the unfairness of competing with foreign producers which greatly benefit from no regulation and the absence of labor costs,
- the State's lead in forming a working partnership between financial institutions, Farmers/Ranchers and state government that would guarantee a certain percentage of farm/ranch loans to those who can qualify
