

## RESOLUTION ENDORSING AND SUPPORTING THE PRINCIPLE OF FAIR AND OPEN HOUSING AS SET FORTH IN TITLE VIII OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1968

WHEREAS, adequate housing is a necessary ingredient to the maintenance of the standard of living in this country; and

WHEREAS, it is important that every human being have access to adequate housing of his choice and economic means; and

WHEREAS, it is beneficial to the social and economic welfare of the entire country that every person have access to adequate housing; and

WHEREAS, the law of the land is that no citizen can be denied access to housing of his choice because of race, color, religion, or national origin; now therefore,

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF POLK, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That this Commissioners Court endorses and supports the principle of fair and open housing; as set forth in Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, and the right of every person to have access to adequate housing of his own choice without regard to race, color, religion, or national origin; and

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That this Commissioners Court encourages all citizens to respect and support the law of the land in regard to the right of every person to have access to adequate housing of his own choice; and

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That this Commissioners Court encourages all citizens to undertake voluntary actions to foster racial harmony, including individual and group decisions to promote fair and open housing, and individual commitment to avoid discrimination in all sale, all rental of property; and

<u>SECTION 4</u>. That this Commissioners Court will encourage local newspapers and owners of housing to comply with HUD Advertising Guidelines, and

<u>SECTION 5</u>. That this Commissioners Court will maintain cooperation with fair housing groups, human relations bodies and other social, civil and religious groups interested in facilitating open communities.

#### Polk County Democratic Primary Run-off Election April 9, 2002

IN SUMMARY: The County Clerk's office will conduct the Early Voting and Mail Ballots.

The Democratic Party will appoint a Democratic Early Ballot Board to work with Sharon Jordan to process Democratic early ballots.

The Democratic Party will conduct Election Day activities, including ordering ballots, preparing ballot boxes & supply boxes for each voting box, hire necessary personnel and secure polling sites.

The Democratic Party will receive ballot cans from election box judges, certify seals, sort and straighten ballots, then present ballot cans to Sharon Jordan for the tabulation process (Steve Hullihen).

The Democratic Party will appoint a Democratic Resolutions Board and a Democratic Presiding Judge for the Tabulation Counting Room.

The County Clerk's office will seal ballot boxes with counted ballots and become custodian of the ballots. Barbara Middleton will report election results to the proper authorities as always.

 Democratic Party of Polk County consists of the county executive committed and the county chair. All decisions have been made by this authority.

 Democratic Party of Polk County is <u>not</u> contracting with the County Clerk's office to conduct this run-off election.

Democratic Party of Polk County will conduct the primary run-off election.

 Democratic Party of Polk County requests to lease the tabulation equipment owned by Polk County (Texas Election Law Sec. 123.033) and requests Polk County staff to operate such equipment.

Democratic Party of Polk County requests "space" somewhere close to the county's
tabulation equipment in order to establish and organize the Democrat Central
Counting Station. (Enough room for one 6 foot table and 2 clerks for receiving ballot
boxes from election box judges, one 6 foot table and 2 clerks for receiving supply
boxes, and two 6 foot tables and 6 clerks for handling ballot boxes and sorting ballots

... the same as the county clerk provided for the republican party counting station). The Democratic Party will bring tables, chairs and any other supplies needed.

- Democratic Party of Polk County will reimburse Polk County for personnel expense for county employees assigned and/or appointed to the counting room staff for the allotted time designated for tabulation and handling of Democratic ballots.
- Democratic Party of Polk County requested use of ballot cans, pad locks and keys to be picked up by Democratic Party staff on (or before, if notified) April 6th, 2002.
- Democratic Party will order ballots, election forms and supplies. The party will prepare ballot cans and supply boxes and distribute to each election box.
- Democratic Party will secure polling sites, appoint election box judges (alternate
  judges and clerks) and handle compensation.
- Democratic Party will appoint an Early Ballot Board (2-3 Democrats) and a Democratic Presiding Judge of the Early Ballot Board.
- Democratic Party will establish and organize a Democratic Central Counting Station, including appointment of a Democratic Presiding Judge of the Central Counting Station and appointment of clerks to perform duties of the Democratic Central Counting Station. Those duties include receiving ballot cans and supply boxes from the election box judges, verifying locks and seals on each ballot can, preparing and sorting of the ballots for the tabulation supervisor's staff and completing any forms/paperwork involved with the process.
- Democratic Party Central Counting Station staff will then present the Democratic ballot boxes to the County's Central Counting Station as directed by the County's Counting Station Manager (Sharon Jordan). At this point, the County's staff will complete the tabulation process.
- Democratic Party will appoint a Democratic Resolutions Board (3 Democrats) to serve with the Democratic Presiding Judge and will be assembled in the County's Counting Station to resolve issues concerning Democratic ballots as needed.
- The Democratic County Chair should be notified as to times of testing of the tabulation equipment (before and after tabulation of ballots). The Democratic Presiding Judge and/or the Democratic County Chair will receive the tabulation results forms, test reports, and any other reports associated with the tabulation process as they are made available.
- The County Clerk's office will conduct the Early Voting process as usual. The Democratic Early Vote ballots will be delivered to the Early Voting staff as soon as they arrive.
- It is agreed Barbara Middleton will communicate election results with the appropriate authorities throughout the counting process.

HOW DOES THE COUNTY SAVE \$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$ The Democratic Party of Polk County will not only save Polk County many hours of labor, but will pay the County for county employees hours connected with the Democratic Party's portion of the election process. And, pay a fee for leasing the County-owned ballot tabulation equipment.

- 1. Time preparing 20 ballot cans vs. 40 ballot cans
- 2. Time preparing 20 supply cans vs. 40 supply cans
- 3. Expense of county employees "covering" for Sharon Jordan being out of her office to prepare ballot cans and supply cans.
- 4. Cost of supplies for 20 supply cans vs. 40 supply cans.
- 5. Having two Early Ballot Boards (3-4 Democrats at one table and 3-4 Republicans at another table) cuts the time in half for processing mail ballots, early voting ballots and mobile voting ballots. 4 hours vs. 8 hours of Sharon Jordan's time connected with the early voting process, 4 hours she can be back at her desk doing the regular duties of the County Clerk's office.
- 6. Time receiving 20 ballot cans on election night vs. 40 ballot cans 2-3 employees wages
- 7. Time sorting ballots in 20 ballot cans vs. 40 cans.... 4-5 employees wages
- 8. Time receiving supply cans and voting booths on election night from 20 election boxes vs. 40 supply cans and voting booths on election night ... 1-2 employees wages
- Tabulating staff's time "on hold" waiting for ballot cans to be opened and ballots sorted on election night would be cut in half... 3-4 employees wages

NOTE: Barbara Middleton stated today she has NEVER charged either party for county employees time/salaries, she has NEVER charged either party for the use of supplies or equipment. She stated the county has always paid all those expenses.
