

Polk County wishes to defray its costs of collection that it incurs under a contract for collection of delinquent court fines and fees between Polk County and the firm of Linebarger Goggan Blair Peña & Sampson, LLP Under the provisions of Article 103 0031, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Polk County Commissioners Court is empowered to authorize the addition of 30% on each debt and account receivable, including fines and fees, that is more than 60 days past due and has been referred to an attorney for collection

CONTRACT FOR COURT FEES AND FINES COLLECTION SERVICES

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF POLK

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between Polk County, Texas, acting herein by and through its governing body, hereinafter styled County, and LINEBARGER GOGGAN BLAIR PEÑA & SAMPSON, LLP, hereinafter styled the Firm

I County agrees to employ and does hereby employ the Firm to enforce The collection of delinquent court fees and fines pursuant to the terms and conditions described in this contract. This contract supercedes all prior oral and written agreements between the parties, and can only be amended if done so in writing and signed by all parties. Furthermore, this contract cannot be transferred or assigned by either party without the written consent of all parties.

II County agrees to refer all delinquent accounts by electronic or magnetic medium, in the specified format, to the Firm for collection, on or about the first (1st) and fifteenth (15th) of each month. An account is considered delinquent when not paid within sixty (60) days of the scheduled appearance date (if the defendant failed to appear), or any granted extension, or from the date of conviction or judgment, or other court specified due date. County will provide the Firm with copies of, or access to, the information and documentation necessary to collect the fees and fines that are subject to this contract. Should it become necessary for the Firm to provide computer hardware, software, programming services and/or in-house personnel to County, in order for this contract to be performed, a separate agreement and fee structure shall be negotiated and agreed to in writing by both parties hereto. The Firm hereby agrees to reimburse Polk County the amount charged by Net Data to install the program required by the Firm on the County's network server for the provision of this contract.

III The Firm is to refer all payments and correspondence directly to the courts that have assessed or levied the fees and fines being collected pursuant to this contract. The Firm reserves the right to return all accounts not collected within one (1) year of referral by County, as well as any accounts identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

V The Firm shall indemnify and hold County harmless from and against all liabilities, losses and/or costs arising from claims for damages, or suits for losses or damages, including reasonable costs and attorney's fees, which may arise as a result of the Firm's performance of the services described in this contract. The indemnity provision of this

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contract shall have no application to any claim or demand which results from the sole negligence or fault of County, its officers, agents, employees or contractors. And furthermore, in the event of joint and/or shared negligence or fault of County and the Firm, responsibility and indemnity, if any, shall be apportioned in accordance with Texas law and without waiving any defenses of either party. The provisions of this paragraph are intended for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and are not intended to create or grant any right, contractual or otherwise, to any other persons or entities. In the event that litigation is initiated against County by a defendant contacted by the Firm in the collection activity of the Firm, then the Firm agrees to represent County in such litigation as part of the services compensated in this contract

V County agrees to pay to the Firm, on all accounts referred to the Firm for collection, a thirty-percent (30%) fee on the total amount collected on all such accounts referred to the Firm for collection, in accordance with Article 103 0031 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, as compensation for legal and collection services provided pursuant to this contract. In the event that an account is not covered by such statute, County agrees to pay the Firm a thirty-percent (30%) fee on the total amount collected on all such accounts referred to the Firm for collection as compensation for legal and collection services provided pursuant to this contract. All compensation shall become the property of the Firm at the time of payment. County shall pay over said funds on a monthly basis by check or wire transfer. County agrees to pay the fee payable under this contract no later than the 30th day following the end of the calendar month within which the fee is paid to County. The parties agree that this contract may be amended to include the collection of fines and fees associated with Class A and B offenses in addition to the Class C offenses covered under this initial contract.

VI The initial term of this contract is two years, beginning May 28, 2002, and shall thereafter continue on a month-to-month basis County reserves the option to extend the initial term of the contract for two additional two-year periods, with the contract thereafter continuing on a month-to-month basis Either party may, without cause, terminate this contract at the end of the initial contract term or thereafter by giving the other party written notice of termination. During the initial term of this contract either party shall have the right to terminate the same prior to its expiration, provided however, that the party giving notice shall grant the receiving party a period of thirty (30) days, from the date of written notice, the opportunity to attempt to cure any unsatisfactory terms, acts, omissions or conditions Should the party receiving notice be found not to have remedied the unsatisfactory terms, acts, omissions or conditions to the satisfaction of the party giving notice, the party giving notice may terminate the contract. The effective date of any termination by County shall be sixty (60) days from the date the notice of termination is received in writing by the Firm, said sixty (60) days period being deemed adequate for the purpose of the Firm in winding down its affairs with regards to work in progress. In the case of termination by the Firm, the effective date of termination shall be thirty (30) days from the date notice of termination is received. County is entitled, but is not required, to refer additional accounts to the Firm after notice of

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termination has been received by the Firm In any event, the Firm shall be entitled to payment of its fee, pursuant to Paragraph V of this contract, for all amounts collected on referred accounts during the six (6) month "winding down" period. At the end of that period, all accounts shall be returned to County by the Firm

In the event that any provision(s) of this contract shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the invalidity, illegality or unenforceability of that provision(s) shall not affect any other provision(s) of this contract, and it shall further be construed as if the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision(s) had never been a part of this contract.

IX In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated, the Firm hereby accepts said employment and undertakes performance of said contract as set-forth above. This contact is executed on behalf of County by the presiding officer of its governing body who is authorized to execute this instrument by order heretofore passed and duly recorded in its minutes. This contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original for all purposes. Signed facsimiles shall be binding and enforceable.
