# STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR COUNTY ROAD CONSTRUCTION PERMANENT ROAD FUND

#### **DESCRIPTION**

These specifications shall govern the construction or reconstruction of all Polk County Roads from the permanent road fund, including but not limited to; the right of way width, drainage, sub-grade, base materials, and surfacing. It is the intent of these specifications that all Polk County road construction and reconstruction be uniform and built to these minimum standards. No exceptions to these specifications will be accepted without the majority consent of the Commissioners Court.

## **RIGHT OF WAY**

The absolute minimum width of right of way shall be 60 feet, unless the road has been a County road since 1980. It is desirable that the minimum width be 80 feet and, in some areas, a width greater than 80 feet may be required. The 60 feet minimum and 80 feet desirable widths are necessary to properly maintain drainage and to accommodate utilities.

#### **DRAINAGE**

All ditches shall be constructed to a minimum depth of two (2) feet below the surface of the roadway. It is desirable that all front slopes and back slopes be constructed at a 4:1 ratio of horizontal distances to vertical distance. In no case shall these slopes be steeper than 3:1. All bottom ditch widths shall be as wide as practical to accommodate the flow of water, but in no case shall be narrower than 3 feet.

All crossroad drainage structures shall be fifteen (15) inches or greater in diameter with a minimum depth of cover of one (1) foot to the top of the pipe, not including base or surfacing.

#### **SUB GRADE**

The sub grade shall be prepared prior to the application of the base material by blading and rolling. Any wet, undesirable subgrade material shall be removed and replaced with a dry, more desirable material prior to base material placement. The subgrade shall be prepared to a minimum crown width of twenty-two (22) feet, whenever possible. The crown shall be shaped and formed to assure proper drainage to a cross slope of no less than 1/4 to 1/2 inch per foot.

### **BASE MATERIAL**

#### Alternate No. 1

Base material shall consist of a naturally occurring bank run or pit run sandy material containing some binder (clay) with approximately 30% naturally occurring rock, gravel or iron ore. This material shall be placed to a minimum depth of six (6) inches compacted in place on the roadway.

#### Alternate No. 2

Base material shall consist of a crushed stone or caliche with enough fines and binder to fill the voids and set up with the material. Any material which visually degradates during blading or rolling shall be considered as not suitable for crushed stone base. This material shall be placed to a minimum depth of eight (8) inches compacted in place on the roadway.

#### Alternate No. 3

Any base material conforming to; Type A (crushed aggregate); Grade three (3) or better of Type C (iron ore); Type 3 or better under item 249, flexible base of the Texas Department of Transportation Standard Specifications. This material shall be placed to a minimum depth of six (6) inches compacted in place on the roadway.

Base material shall be sprinkled bladed and compacted to a desired density. All base materials shall be placed to an uniform depth and a minimum width of twenty-two (22) feet over the roadway.

#### **SURFACING**

Surfacing, when required, shall consist of Type 1, Seal Coat or Type 2, Hot Mix Asphaltic Concrete, with a minimum width of eighteen (18) feet.

Type 1

A type 1 seal coat surface shall consist of 2-CRSE5 of asphaltic material and aggregate. The asphaltic material application shall be as per manufacturer's recommendation for asphalt and aggregate.

Type 2

Type 2 or hot mix asphaltic concrete shall be as specified on a project-by-project basis. In no case shall the hot mix be placed at a depth less than one (1) inch.

Type 3

Type 3 shall be a single coarse re-seal on existing roadways.

#### PROJECT LIMITS AND APPROVAL

Prior to beginning construction on any county roadway utilizing Permanent Road Funds, projects must be approved by the Commissioners Court. Expenditures eligible for payment from the Permanent Road Fund shall be limited to; road base material, chip & seal or other comparable asphalt topping, machinery rental, part-time labor, or any other expenditure deemed appropriate by the Commissioner Court.
