The Texas Department of Human Services (DHS), hereinafter referred to as the Department, and Polk County Aging Services, hereinafter referred to as the Provider, hereby amend the Contract for Community Care Programs as described below.

The Department and the Provider agree to the following amendment to the Contract for Community Care Programs:

I. Section II, Item G is amended to include the following language:

If the contractor terminates business operations, the contractor must ensure that:

- (1) Records are stored and accessible;
- (2) Someone is responsible for adequately maintaining the records;
- (3) The DHS contract manager is notified in writing about how and where the records will be maintained and who DHS will contact in order to access the records; and
- (4) If information in item three (3) changes, the contractor provides updated information to the DHS contract manager. The information must be provided within 10 workdays and be in writing.
- II. The effective date of this amendment is July 1, 2004.

All other terms and conditions of the Contract for Community Care Programs remain in full force and effect.

TEMPORARY EASEMENT FOR BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, Grantor does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Grantee, four (4) temporary easements adjacent to County Road 219 and described as parcel numbers 1E, 2E, 3E and 4E on Exhibits "A" through "D" respectively attached hereto and made a part hereof for bridge construction purposes on, over and across certain lands of the Grantor in the H. Ware Survey, Abstract 739, Polk County, Texas (The Premises).

The said Easement herein granted is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that as a further consideration for the easement granted hereunder, Grantee does hereby release and discharge Grantor from any and all liability, claim or demand which Grantee may have or claim to have now or hereafter, against Grantor resulting from, arising out of or in any manner associated with any forestry operation of the Grantor in the management of its properties.
- 2. All property of whatever kind or nature which may be now or hereinafter placed in, on or about the Premises by or for the Grantee shall be at the sole risk of Grantee. Grantor shall not be liable to the Grantee for any damage or loss to said property or for any injury or death taking place on the premises.
- 3. The Grantee covenants to indemnify and hold forever harmless the Grantor and Grantor's Land Manager, Molpus Timberlands Management, LLC., a Mississippi limited liability Company ("MTM"), against each and every claim, demand or cause of action that may be made or come against Grantor and/or MTM by reason of or in any way arising out of Grantee's activities on and/or use of the premises.

4. Grantee shall comply with all laws and ordinances and with the rules and regulations of any codes of Federal, State or local authority applicable to the use of the premises, including, but not limited to, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act, Clean Water Act, and Clean Air Act and the National Electric Safety Code.

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- 5. Grantee shall repair, to the satisfaction of Grantor or its representative, any damage it shall cause to Grantor's private roads, lanes or ditches.
- 6. Grantor hereby reserves the right to cut and reclaim the timber on the affected property. In addition, Grantor shall be allowed to conduct and continue its business operations near the easement herein granted in the ordinary and usual course of its business.
- 7. Grantee agrees and covenants to pay Grantor, at the then market value, for any of Grantor's timber lying outside of said easement destroyed or damaged from acts or omissions of Grantee, its employees, agents or contractors at any time during the period this grant is in force. All stumps, brush, limbs or other debris of any kind which Grantee desires to clear from said easement shall be placed, piled and burned or otherwise disposed of in such manner that there will be no increased fire or bug hazard to the timber of Grantor on or near the premises or to defacement of the timber or other property of Grantor. No stumps, brush, limbs or other debris shall be burned, piled or placed on property of Grantor lying outside the premises.
- 8. Grantee shall have the full responsibility for obtaining any and all federal, state and local permits or licenses and shall fully comply with all of the laws, rules, regulations and requirements of any and all federal, state or local government, authority, agency, commission or regulatory body insofar as the same may apply to Grantee's operations hereunder and particularly as such laws, rules, regulations and requirements may relate to protection of the environment, water and air.
- 9. The easement herein granted and all rights and privileges in connection herewith shall automatically revert to Grantor, its successors and assigns, immediately upon the completion of construction by Grantee on its adjacent bridge projects.
- 10. Grantee shall have thirty (30) days from and after the date of the expiration of this agreement to remove all property or fixtures placed by Grantee on the premises. Unless the time period is extended by written consent of Grantor, any property or fixtures of Grantee left on the premises after the appropriate removal date may be removed from the premises at the direction of Grantor, but at the sole risk and expense of Grantee.
- Grantee shall, prior to cutting any fences of Grantor, secure "H" braces therein in such a manner as to prevent fence sagging. Upon expiration of this temporary agreement, Grantee will re-fence all said gaps in a good and workmanlike manner.
- 12. RESOLUTION EXPRESSING INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES TO BE INCURRED BY POLK COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, the Issuer will make, or has made not more than 60 days prior to the date hereof, payments with respect to the acquisition, construction, repair and equipping of the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto;

WHEREAS, the Issuer has concluded that it does not currently desire to issue tax-exempt obligations to finance the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto;

WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof; and,

WHEREAS, the Issuer reasonably expects to issue tax-exempt obligations to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1. The Issuer reasonably expects to reimburse itself for all costs that have been or will be paid subsequent to the date that is 60 days prior to the date hereof and that are to be paid in connection with the acquisition, construction, repair and equipping of the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof.

Section 2. This resolution is also made to evidence the intent of the Issuer to make such reimbursements under Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2 and Section 1201.042, Texas Government Code.

Section 3. The Issuer reasonably expects that the maximum principal amount of tax-exempt obligations issued to reimburse the Issuer for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto will not exceed \$ 196,166.00.

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REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS AND FOR PROPOSALS FOR FINANCING, DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF DETENTION FACILITY (Polk County Commissioners Court)

Sealed Responses to Request for Qualifications addressed to the Polk County Commissioners Court will be received on or before **9.300**m. on June **28**, 2004, at the office of the County Judge, Polk County Courthouse, 101 W. Church, Livingston, Texas 77351, for the financing, design, construction, operation and management of a 500 bed adult detention center/facility. The Response shall be based on the County's Request for Qualification form available at the Office of the County Judge. Sealed Proposals for the Project will, thereafter, be received from qualified Respondents on July **20**, 2004, at the Office of the County Judge. The proposal shall be in conformance with the Request for Proposal Specifications available at the above address.

Price or cost-related information is not to be submitted with the Response to Request for Qualifications, but will be required in the Proposal.

Significant bond, indemnification and insurance requirements will be placed on the successful respondent, including the provision of performance and payment bonds. All contract requirements of the Request for Proposal Specifications and Section 351.103 of the <u>Local Government Code</u> (V.T.C.A.) will be required to be agreed to and met by the successful respondent.

The financing proposal shall provide for lease-purchase of the Facility by the County, with an option to purchase, and transfer of legal title upon payment of all lease payments. The County shall have no liability or cost for the Facility financing except to the extent of prisoner housing contract revenues actually generated by the Facility and received. The financing proposal shall include all costs of planning, financing, design, construction, equipping, furnishing and start-up of the Facility, including all costs of land and professional fees.

The operation and management proposed will be required to be in conformance with the rules and regulations of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards, the Operation and Management Agreement between the successful respondent and the County, and rules of jurisdictions housing prisoners at the Facility to the extent made applicable by the terms of the prisoner housing contracts with those jurisdictions; and any applicable Federal regulations regarding the housing of federal prisoners. The compensation for the operation and management of the Facility will be paid on the basis of a per prisoner, per day fee, payable solely out of the net revenues of the Facility, and from no other source, after first application of gross revenues to the Lease obligations.

Design of the Facility must be by competent design professionals licensed in the State of Texas with significant experience in the design of detention facilities. The design and construction of the Facility must be in accordance with the standards of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards, and the successful respondent must obtain all

required approvals and certifications of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards. Respondents shall present a firm bid for the design, construction, equipping, and furnishing of the Facility in accordance with the requirements of the Request for Proposal Specifications.

The successful respondent will be required to provide all development and project management services necessary to assure timely financing, design and construction of the Facility in accordance with the successful proposal, the plans and specifications, applicable contracts, and the project budget.

The County will not obligate its funds or tax revenues to pay for any component of this project, including the operation and management of the Facility, and the sole source of funding for repayment of financing, design, construction, operation and management or other associated costs and expenses shall be the revenues actually generated by the Facility and received. The financing shall not be a debt or obligation of the County, and, upon termination of or default on the financing, the County must have no liability or obligation for repayment of the financing.

This Request for Qualifications and Proposals is for submittals from respondents that are able to provide the entire comprehensive project either on their own or as part of a respondent team. The separate elements of the overall project will not be separately submitted for proposals. Only respondents having the ability to provide all parts of the project (financing, design, construction and operation) should respond.

The Response to the Request for Qualifications, and consideration thereof, shall be considered Phase I of the process. The Proposal submission, and consideration thereof, shall be considered Phase II of the process.
