Regulations and Provisions to Permit Construction on County Road Right-of-Way

It is the intent of Polk County to adopt rules and regulations for installing, adjusting, altering, maintaining and/or relocating pipelines or utility lines which include minimum applicable requirements as set forth by the State of Texas and the Code of Federal Regulations for construction, operation, maintenance and relocation of such pipelines and facilities. These specifications cover all public utility lines, mains, low pressure and high pressure pipelines and will be permitted for construction, alteration, maintenance or relocation under the following regulations and provision;

- A) In the event it becomes necessary to alter or relocate the pipeline or utility for which permission is sought, due to widening or improving the county roads within the existing road easement at the point or along the route of said utility construction, applicant or its successor, if any, will perform the alteration or relocation at its own cost and expense and said applicant/company will save and hold harmless Polk County from claims, or causes of action arising from any claims for damages or injuries sustained by any person or property occasioned by its operation under this permit;
- B) All crossing of county roads and of driveways accessing county roads, hereinafter referred to as "road crossings", will be bored unless stipulated otherwise by the County Commissioner of the precinct in which the subject road is located;
- C) All road crossings will be at a minimum depth of sixty inches (60") below the lowest existing grade for a minimum distance of twenty feet (20") beyond each right-of-way line;
- D) All parallel utility construction will be a minimum depth of forty-eight inches (48") below existing road ditches.
- Any damage whatsoever to any county road, roadbed, ditch or structure on or in the county right-of-way caused by laying, constructing, maintaining, repairing or relocating of a utility and/or pipeline in, under, across or along county road right-of-way shall be repaired immediately and restored to as good or better condition as before construction. Such repair and restoration will be at the sole cost and expense of the owner or operator of the pipeline or utility;
- F) In the event construction is delayed or halted by adverse weather conditions, labor stoppages or mechanical difficulties, the company will ensure that all ditches are cleaned and will drain as good or better than before construction;
- While the contractor is upon county right-of-way, all spoils, materials and excavations will be marked with proper barricades and lights at night, on holidays and weekends. If contractor's machinery impedes any lane of traffic, contractor will provide as many flagmen as is necessary to provide for the safe, orderly movement of vehicular traffic;

H)	Applicant shall submit a rout map and plat indicating the description of the point the pipeline o utility begins and the direction and the distance of the proposed utility and/or pipeline, as i affects the county roads through Polk County, Texas;
I)	Applicant shall submit detailed plans and specifications for the construction, alteration maintenance and relocation of such utility of pipeline, indicating proposed work to be performed type of construction, type of material or pipe, size of material or pipe and, if pipe, wall thickness of pipe, type of material/substance to be carried in the pipe and the anticipated working pressure;
J)	At least forty-eight (48) hours before commencing construction of any pipeline or utility in under, across or along any county road, notice of the time such construction is to commence shal be given by the applicant to the County Commissioner of the precinct in which the work is being done in order that the County Commissioner or his/her agent may supervise and inspect such construction. However, in cases of emergency requiring immediate maintenance or repair of any pipeline or utility, notice should be given to the County Commissioner as soon as possible;
K)	Upon completion of construction in, under, across or along county road right-of-way, contractor will notify the County Commissioner so that a final inspection may be made;
L)	A non-refundable application fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) will be assessed before any type of construction in, under, across or along county road right-of-way may commence;

WHEREAS, the Issuer will make, or has made not more than 60 days prior to the date hereof, payments with respect to the acquisition, construction, repair and equipping of the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto;

WHEREAS, the Issuer has concluded that it does not currently desire to issue tax-exempt obligations to finance the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto;

WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof; and,

WHEREAS, the Issuer reasonably expects to issue tax-exempt obligations to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1. The Issuer reasonably expects to reimburse itself for all costs that have been or will be paid subsequent to the date that is 60 days prior to the date hereof and that are to be paid in connection with the acquisition, construction, repair and equipping of the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof.

Section 2. This resolution is also made to evidence the intent of the Issuer to make such reimbursements under Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2 and Section 1201.042, Texas Government Code.

Section 3. The Issuer reasonably expects that the maximum principal amount of tax-exempt obligations issued to reimburse the Issuer for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto will not exceed \$31,485.00.

To Whom It May Concern:

On 02-03-2005 at approximately 1700, 8 inmates were moved from tank N, to tank 9 due to a faulty locking device on the cell door rendering that housing area unusable for safety and security reasons. This action effectively reduced our capacity from 119 to 109. On 02-08-2005 a service representative from ISI visited the Polk County Jail. Many of the paracentric, mogul and slider devices, (security cell doors) in the Polk County Jail Facility are in need of service or repair. The faulty locking device was repaired and the housing area was placed back in service. On February 3, 2005 this office received an estimate via fax from ISI Detention Contracting Group regarding the locks and keys in the Polk County Jail. To clean, adjust and lubricate all locking devices in the Polk County Jail could cost about \$ 16,800.00. This is figured on 2 men working eight hours a day for approximately 15 days at \$ 70.00 an hour. While inspecting the existing cell door locking devices throughout the jail, the service representative noted that the locking devices on the cell doors are extremely out-dated. He further stated that should any of the locking devices need repair, he thought it would be extremely difficult to obtain replacement parts, and in that case a newer locking device would need to be installed. ISI was contacted through Gary Adams. Also an estimate was sent from Central Restaurant Products for replacement of ageing kitchen appliances, specifically freezer and refrigerators. To replace current models with their equivalent breaks down as follows: 1 walk in freezer 7'9"x 7'9" at a cost of \$6095.00. 1 walk in cooler 5'10' x 7'9" at a cost of \$4450.00. 2 solid door refrigerators 54" x 29 1/2" x 83 1/4" at a cost of \$4090.00. Also Skyline Equipment was contacted regarding replacement of an ageing washer and dryer in the jail laundry. To replace one washer and one dryer with their equivalent would be approximately \$9,860.00. Both of these areas are critical to the safe operation of the Polk County Jail, one for security reasons and the other for sanitary reasons.

Clean, adjust, and lubricate all cell doors and locking devices in the jail: \$16,800.00

Replace one washer and one dryer in laundry: \$9,860.00

Replace on walk in freezer: \$6095.00 Replace on walk in cooler: \$4450.00

Replace 2 solid door refrigerators" \$4090.00

Total: \$41,295.00

JAIL UPRADES

Introduction:

- I. Paint ---<u>\$3,000.00</u>
 - A. Painting of Administration offices.
 - 1. During visual inspection of the administration offices it was discovered that there was a pre-existing mold problem.
 - The mold was an issue which needed to be handled by first getting samples to find out if the mold was of a health hazard to the employees.
 - A report of the samples were obtained and it was discovered to be of a type which needed to be handled by a mold remediation team; due to state regulated guidelines. This will be handled in a separate presentation pertaining to the mold.
 - B. Painting of the cell and inmate areas.
 - The labor on this area can be accomplished with inmate labor at no cost to the county.
 - 2. The cost of material and paint to paint this area will be included in this proposal.
- II. Plumbing ---Parts -- \$12,100.00 / Contractor -- \$20,786.00= \$32,886.00
 - A. Several of the plumbing fixtures are out-dated and obsolete; making it hard or impossible to obtain parts for.
 - 1. Parts will be supplied by the Maintenance Engineering Dept.
 - 2. Labor will be by contractor and included in the total plumbing bid.
 - B. There were no cut off valves installed in the initial building of the jail. This makes it impossible to work on one area of the jail without turning off the water to the whole building. Some of these gate valves that were put in are made of brass and due to the water supply from the city these valves are deteriorating to the point that they are falling apart. This has caused situations which has resulted in call outs which can be prevented by installing ball valves.
 - C. The drain is busted under the concrete at a depth of 4 to 5 feet in K-tank. This will require the slab being busted up to repair this shower.
 - D. Unless otherwise specified all parts and labor will be included in contractors bid.

III. Locks and keys for doors

- A. The locks and doors in the jail are worn out to the point that it is a continual problem securing doors. This is a security issue for the jail; and a safety issue for the employees and other inmates of the jail.
- B. All parts and labor will be included in the bid from the contractor to refurbish the locks and replace any keys which are worn to the point of needing to be replaced or duplicated.

IV. HVAC system --- \$37,110.00

- A. All HVAC units will need to be cleaned at the same time that all ducts are being cleaned. This must be done at the same time for health reasons.
- B. The HVAC units in the mold area will need a thorough cleaning which will involve taking the units apart. Due to the age of the units (18 yrs.) the equipment may not be able to be re-assembled to a working state. My recommendation would be to replace the units with new ones at this time. The units in question have had continual problems in the recent past.
- C. All HVAC work, parts, labor, and electrical will be included in the contractors bid.

V. Mold Remediation -- \$57,099.00 / State Fees -- \$3,500.00= \$60,599.00

- A. Due to state mandated regulations the mold issue will be conducted under state guidelines by a Mold Remediation Specialist.
- B. Polk County will be responsible for paying for Air Quality samples.
- C. Polk County will be responsible for providing a dumpster for the removed debris and construction debris.

Conclusion:

Due to the continual health complaints and liability issues pertaining to the mold; this matter needs to be addressed as soon as possible. The mold remediation and all parts concerning mold is the first part of this request to be considered during the planning of the work schedule. This request is based on the health and welfare of the County Employees first and formost. The fact that due to budget limitations many of these items have had to be handled on a as needed bases. This has caused problems for the Maintenance Engineering Dept. as well as the Sheriffs Department which can be eliminated or done at a overall lower cost. Due to the nature of the use of this building and the fact that it is in use twenty four hours a day; the building needs more attention than other buildings. This is cost which will be incurred by the County in one way or another in the very near future.
