MEDICAL SERVICE AGREEMENT



This Medical Service Agreement, effective as of the 14th day of February, 2006, is by and between Memorial Medical Center-Livingston and Memorial Medical Center-Lufkin ("hospitals") and Polk County, Texas ("County"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas. This agreement is for provision of hospital services to "County eligible residents". "County" designates the "Hospitals" as a mandated provider, with eligibility criteria set forth by Polk County Commissioners Court in accordance with Chapter 61 of the Health and Safety Code, Indigent Health Care Act.

MANDATED PROVIDER

In reference to this instrument, a mandated provider is defined according to the Indigent Healthcare Act as a provider selected by a County that agrees to provide available health care services to eligible County residents. This designation relieves a Mandated Provider from the "five day notification letter" and "72 hour telephone notification" to the County designee. The "hospitals" shall refer patients to call the Polk County Social Services Department for pre-screening and to initiate the application process.

I. SERVICES

- a. "Hospitals" agrees to provide available medical services to qualified "County" eligible residents at Memorial Medical Center-Livingston and Memorial Medical Center-Lufkin. Outpatient, emergency room and inpatient hospital services will be rendered including but not limited to appropriate diagnostic, laboratory, radiology, and therapeutic services. During the hospital discharge procedures Hospital, if medically appropriate, will refer patient to the designated Primary Care Provider (PCP), as set forth by "County", for continuity of care. At the request of "County", "Hospitals" will provide appropriate discharge summaries and consultation reports concerning medical services rendered to County Eligible Resident. All services shall be rendered based upon "medical necessity".
- b. All medically necessary inpatient services shall be administered, by "Hospitals" to achieve patient stabilization, enabling hospital transfer or appropriate hospital discharge.

II PATIENT TRANSFER

- a. In the event "Memorial Medical Center-Livingston" is unable to provide medically necessary services, upon patient stabilization, patient shall be transferred to Memorial Medical Center of East Texas-Lufkin for immediate and medically necessary treatment. In the event Memorial Lufkin Hospital is unable to provide treatment, appropriate transfer shall be conducted to another facility for the medical treatment.
- b. All transfers require appropriate physician to physician referrals. Transfers to another facility will be based upon availability of resources and services.
- c. The treating physicians for "Hospital" will contact the referred facility medical faculty staff to determine facility's acceptance of patient and agree on the stability of patient prior to actual transfer.
- d. Medical reports will be forwarded to the referring facility at the time of transfer or as appropriate.

III PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS

- a. Prescription medications will be administered to patient as medically necessary and in accordance with Hospitals' pharmacy policy during the administering of inpatient and/or outpatient emergency services to County Eligible residents.
- b. If medically necessary and applicable and during hospital discharge of patient, "County" will provide medication subject to the limitations of the County Indigent Healthcare policy.
- c. Medications not covered under the County Indigent Healthcare policy, will be the responsibility of patient(s).

IV COMPENSATION

a. Invoice billing

"Hospitals" shall invoice "County" utilizing Form UB-92 to include all medical and billing codes as stipulated by Medicaid billing procedures and other codes and information as requested by "County".

b. Reimbursement

"County" shall reimburse "Hospitals" as set forth by Chapter 61, of the Health and Safety Code-Indigent Health Care Act for outpatient and inpatient services, including MRI and Cat Scan referral out-patient services to be payable by Medicaid CPT codes.

V RELATIONSHIP AND INDEMNIFICATION OF PARTIES

The relationship of the parties under this Agreement is solely that of independent contractors. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute, be construed to be, or create a partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the parties hereto or any of their contractors.

"County" and "Hospitals", to the extent authorized under the Texas Constitution and Texas laws, without limitation, Chapter 102, Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, agree to hold each party, its officers, employees, and agents harmless from and indemnify each of them against any and all claims, actions, damages, suits, proceedings, judgments, and liabilities for personal injury, death, or property damage resulting from the acts or omissions of "County" or "Hospitals" or others under "County" and "Hospitals" supervision or control, and the acts of God, material or labor restriction by any governmental authority, civil riot, floods, hurricanes, or other natural disasters, and any other cause not reasonable within the control of "County" or "Hospitals" and which by the exercise of due diligence of "County and/or "Hospitals" is unable, wholly or in part, to prevent or overcome.

"County" and "Hospitals" shall uphold requirements of the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and the Privacy Rule published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services at 45 CFR 160-164 (Privacy Rule). HIPAA and the Rule regulate the services of protected health information.

TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- a. **Term**. This agreement supercedes all other previous agreements and shall remain in full force and effect for period of twelve months and automatically renew subsequently in twelve months term unless terminated as provided herein.
- b. Optional Termination. In the event either party shall, with or without cause, at any time give to the other party at least 30 (thirty) days advance written notice. This Agreement shall terminate on the future date specified in such notice.
- c. Notice. Any notice, demand or communication required, permitted or desired to be given hereunder shall be deemed effectively given when personally delivered or mailed by prepaid certified mail, return receipt requested.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that Polk County Commissioners Court, upon acceptance by the Medical Provider, does hereby appoint Memorial Medical Health System-Livingston and Memorial Medical Health System-Lufkin as a Polk County Mandated Provider, as described by the Indigent Health Care Act.

Subject: Setting fees for Electronic Voting Equipment

Dear Sirs,

The County Clerk and staff are in the process of implementing all the new electronic voting units for the Republican & Democratic Primaries. We have now received almost all of the equipment and the Election Systems & Software installers are here getting ready for training of our staff and Poll Workers. We are planning some public Demonstrations within the county to be held soon. In addition to the electronic voting equipment we have also purchased Palm size computers called Election Assistants, for Voter Registration list that assist us in qualifying the voter easier and more efficiently. Those computers can also be rented or leased to other entities for expedited use.

According to the Help America Vote Act of 2002, all counties, cities, school districts and municipal utility districts must utilize an accessible electronic voting equipment for all disabled persons, for all elections beginning January 2006.

I have met recently with the City of Livingston and the Livingston Independent School District concerning the use of our new county election equipment. I am requesting court approval of entering into an Interlocal Agreement or Contract with each entity to assist them in complying with all the HAVA requirements.

- 1. That a HOME application for HOME funds is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the County with the Texas Department if Housing and Community Affairs.
- 2. That the applications be for \$300,000 of grant funds to carry out owner occupied housing rehabilitation / replacement costs and \$12,000 for administrations funds.
- 3. That the County Commissioners Court directs and designates the County Judge as the County's Chief Executive Officer and Authorized Representative to act in all matters in connection with this application and the County's participation in the HOME Program.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LIVINGSTON AND THE COUNTY OF POLK

WHEREAS, the County of Polk, ("the County"), in compliance with the requirements of the Texas Election Code and regulations promulgated by the Secretary of State of the State of Texas has appropriated and maintains equipment required to conduct elections; and

WHEREAS, the City of Livingston ("the City"), desires to acquire the use of certain items of equipment and the services of the County Clerk of Polk County in tabulation of votes entered in its scheduled elections; and

WHEREAS, a joint agreement between the County and City would benefit the voters in the said elections serving a valid governmental purpose by the provision of such equipment and services; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Texas Government Code §791.001, et seq., authorizes the County and City to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of achieving the governmental functions and providing the services represented herein;

NOW THEREFORE, the County and the City, hereby enter into this Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") and mutually promise and agree to the terms and conditions described herein.

1. INCORPORATION OF PREAMBLES, DEFINITIONS.

- A. The preambles to this Agreement are incorporated in this Agreement and are found and determined to be true and correct.
- B. Where found in this agreement, the following terms shall be defined:
 - 1. The term "election period" shall mean the date scheduled for election, together with the time prescribed by the Secretary of State of the State of Texas for early voting, for runoff elections and for recount of ballots required incident thereto.

2. EQUIPMENT TO BE PROVIDED BY POLK COUNTY:

For its next general election, scheduled for the 13th day of May, 2006, and including the early voting period designated between May 1, 2006 and May 9, 2006, and including the runoff election period designated between May 21, 2006 and July 8, 2006, and for similar periods incident to such subsequent elections as may be scheduled and specified by mutual agreement between the County and the City by written addendum hereto, the County will provide the

following equipment for the exclusive use of the City:

- A. Election booths, number to be determined at the time of equipment is reserved;
- B. Ballot cans, number to be determined at the time equipment is reserved;
- C. Palm Size Computers, number to be determined at the time equipment is reserved, with keyboards, programmed with up to date Voter Registration lists suitable to qualify prospective voters;
- D. iVotronic Touch Screen Voting System units, number to be determined at the time the equipment is reserved, or similar equipment then in use by the County and qualified by the Secretary of State of the State of Texas which provide ADA compliant features required by law to support voters who may be physically impaired, and voters who require wheelchair access, together with sufficient personal electronic ballots sufficient fo ruse in the said units; and
- E. Such other incidental supplies as are mutually agreed between the Polk County Clerk and the City Secretary for the City of Livingston.

3. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY POLK COUNTY:

- A. For its next general election, scheduled for the 13th day of May, 2006, and including any runoff election or re-count of ballots required or incident thereto, and for such subsequent elections as may be scheduled and specified by mutual agreement between the County and the City by written addendum hereto, the county will provide tabulation of votes entered by optical scan ballots and electronic ballots as submitted to the County Clerk at the conclusion of voting on the date scheduled for the City election. The County Clerk will then return the ballots to the City Secretary for storage.
- B. No later than April 15, 2006, and at any subsequent time as may be scheduled and specified by mutual agreement between the County and the City by written addendum hereto, the County Clerk will provide City election personnel with training in the use of equipment provided hereunder.
- C. The County will test the equipment to be used by the City to ensure its correct operation during the election, and is responsible for the correct tabulation of the ballots surrendered by the City, together with the security of the ballots until they are returned to the City for storage.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF THE CITY:

A. The City will pay TWO HUNDRED AND NO/100 (\$200.00) DOLLARS for use of each iVotronic Touch Screen Voting System unit provided by the County for

each election period in which election is required to be held. The City will reserve equipment on the last day available to the City to cancel an election. If an election is cancelled by the City, no charge for equipment will be incurred.

- B. The City will pay TWENTY-FIVE AND NO/100 (\$25.00) DOLLARS for use of each Palm Size Computer (with keyboard and voter registration list) provided by the County for each election period in which election is required to be held. The City will reserve equipment on the last day available to the City to cancel an election. If an election is cancelled by the City, no charge for equipment will be incurred.
- C. The City will provide its optical scan ballots and personal electronic ballots to the County Clerk for tabulation immediately at the conclusion of the election.
- D. The City will reimburse the County for overtime labor costs incurred incident to tabulation of votes, as such costs are itemized by statement provided to the City by the County.
- E. The City will transport any equipment provided by the County to its polling place, picking up the equipment from and returning the equipment to the sites designated by the County Clerk.
- F. The City will be responsible for storage of ballots as required by law following the election.

5. TERM:

This agreement shall be effective the 1st day of March, 2006, and shall continue on a year to year basis unless cancelled by thirty (30) day written notice by either of the parties hereto.

6. SEVERABILITY:

In case any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement shall, for any reason, be held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable in any respect, such illegality, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Contract and this Contract shall be construed as if such illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

7. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. No amendment, modification or alteration of the terms of this Agreement shall be binding on either party unless the same is in writing, dated subsequent to the date hereof, and is duly executed by the parties.

8. FORCE MAJEURE:

Neither party to this Agreement is required to perform any contract obligation under this Agreement so long as performance is delayed or prevented by force majeure, which includes any present or future laws, rule or regulation or ordinance of the United States, the State of Texas, or any rule, regulation or order heretofore or hereafter promulgated by any federal or state governmental body, agency or official, or war, rebellion, insurrection, riot, storm, tornado, flood and other acts of God and any other acts of God, and any other cause not reasonably with the City's or County's control and that the City or County, by exercising due diligence cannot prevent or overcome in whole or in part.

9. NOTICES:

This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the County and City created by this Agreement are performable in Polk County, Texas.


