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JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT

Pursuant to the attached Joint Election Orders to be adopted by the Polk County Commissioners Court and the Lower Trinity Groundwater Conservation District Board of Directors, this Joint Election Agreement is made between Polk County, Texas (the "County") and the Lower Trinity Groundwater Conservation District (the "District") upon the following terms and conditions:

- Both the County and the district are to hold elections on November 7, 2006. The
 County will be conducting general elections and the District will be holding a
 confirmation election. The County and the District have determined that a joint
 election will facilitate the orderly conduct of the elections.
- The District will have only one proposition to be submitted to the voters in the County. The County has agreed to include the proposition on its ballot which will be presented to the voters both in early election and on November 7, 2006.
- 3. The County and the District have determined that there will not be significant additional costs to the County to include the District's confirmation proposition. The expenses of the election shall be paid by the County.
- 4. The County's Election Administrator shall serve as the election administrator for the District. The election administrator will conduct the District election as follows:
 - a. The District's early voting shall be conducted at the same times and places as the County's' early voting;
 - b. A single ballot will be used;
 - c. One set of ballot boxes will be used and the County's custodian of the key to the ballot box shall be the joint custodian;

- d. The forms and records used at the County's polling places shall be combined to include the District's proposition; and
- e. The election records will be maintained for the District as required by law.
- 5. The County's Election Administrator will count the votes and report the same to the District in time for the District to canvas the same within the period required by law.

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BI -ANNUAL AGREEMENT SOUTHEAST TEXAS FOOD BANK

For good and valuable consideration from the Southeast Texas Food Bank ("STFB"), the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the undersigned Agency (the "Agency") agrees as follows:

- 1. Unlike product that is purchased wholesale or retail by the Agency, all products received from STFB by the Agency will remain at all times subject to the restrictions set forth in this agreement.
- 2. All product received from STFB by the Agency must be distributed according to the Internal Revenue Service regulations for product donated for distribution to the needy, as well as according to the guidelines outlined by STFB.
- 3. The Agency is a non-profit organization that has received a written determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service to the effect that it is an organization described in Section 501 (c)(3) of the IRS Code of 1954, or that it is a bonafide church which is considered tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3). The Agency will notify STFB immediately of any changes in its tax exempt status.
- 4. The Agency will not share with or sell STFB product to non-member agencies, agency programs or other entities, persons or businesses, for profit, exchange, trade, barter for services or favor.
- 5. The Agency will not share with or sell STFB product to other member agencies or agency programs.
- 6. The Agency will not require any individual to attend a religious or political meeting, make a statement of faith, or pledge membership to any religious or political organization in exchange for product received. Distribution by a church must be open to the public. Church members, pantry workers or drivers, shall not be served first to be given more or better items.
- 7. The rules for acceptance and participation in the program are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, age, sex disability, national origin or political affiliation.
- 8. The Agency will follow all food storage requirements and membership criteria of STFB.
- 9. The Agency will take all product obtained at STFB directly to its own storage site that STFB has approved. Any change in the location of the Agency or storage site and any major program changes must be reported to STFB in a timely fashion.
- 10. The Agency will inspect product upon receipt and will not distribute unfit product. The Agency has the right to refuse delivery of any product from STFB that it feels is inferior or undersirable in any way. The Agency will contact STFB to report any unfit product. The Agency understands that STFB reserves the right to limit the quantity and type of product received by any agency or program.
- 11. The Agency operating a pantry program will follow "Membership Requirements for Using Food Bank Products for Pantry Programs" and the Agency operating a Meal Site Program will follow "Membership Requirements for Using Food Bank Products for Meal Site Programs".

- 12. The Agency releases both the original donor and STFB from any liability resulting from the condition of the received product and further agrees to indemnify and hold STFB and the original donor free and harmless against all and any liability, damage, losses, claims, causes of action and suits of law or any action of Agency in connection with its storage or use of the product received. There have been no express warranties made in relation to product received from STFB.
- 13. The Agency will pay all agency fees either on the day of pick-up or within 30 days of the invoice date.
- 14. The Agency understands that STFB is to be considered only as a supplemental source of product for its membership.
- 15. The Agency will provide STFB all appropriate requests for paperwork within 30 days of the request by STFB.
- 16. The Agency agrees to annual Civil Rights training with Food Distribution Program staff which may be completed through a self-study guide distributed through TDHS, hanging a civil rights poster in an area visible to clients and turning in monthly distribution reports to receive and distribute USDA commodities.
- 17. The Agency understands that courtesy and professional conduct are practiced and required by both parties.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR PERFORMANCE OF POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS BY HARRIS COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER

THE STATE OF TEXAS

§

COUNTY OF HARRIS

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made pursuant to chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code (the Interlocal Cooperation Act) and chapter 49 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, and entered into by and between Harris County, acting by and through its governing body, the Harris County Commissioners Court, and Polk County (the "Requesting County"), acting by and through its governing body, the Polk County Commissioners Court.

RECITALS:

Pursuant to article 49.25 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Harris County has established and maintains the Office of Medical Examiner;

The Requesting County does not have a medical examiner, and a justice of the peace is required to conduct an inquest into the death of a person who dies in the county under certain circumstances;

If the justice of the peace determines that a postmortem examination is necessary, the justice of the peace may order that a postmortem examination of the body be performed by a physician; and

The Requesting County desires to obtain the services of the Office of the Harris County Medical Examiner (the "Medical Examiner") to perform postmortem examinations on persons who died in the Requesting County and to provide sworn testimony in connection with any inquest by a justice of the peace or any criminal investigation or prosecution conducted by a prosecuting attorney.

NOW, THEREFORE, Harris County and the Requesting County, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do mutually agree as follows:

TERMS:

I. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall begin on June 1, 2006 and end on May 31, 2008, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions contained herein.

II. SERVICES

- A. <u>Postmortem Examinations</u>. Postmortem examinations will be performed by the Medical Examiner pursuant to chapter 49 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure at the Joseph A. Jachimczyk Forensic Center ("Forensic Center") in Houston, Texas. In those cases where a complete autopsy is deemed unnecessary by the Medical Examiner to ascertain the cause and manner of death, the Medical Examiner may perform an external examination of the body, which may include taking x-rays of the body and extracting bodily fluids for laboratory analysis.
 - 1. Written Request. When a justice of the peace in the Requesting County determines pursuant to article 49.10 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, that a postmortem examination is necessary on the body of a deceased person who died within their jurisdiction, the justice of the peace may request that the Medical Examiner perform an autopsy. Each request for a postmortem examination shall be in writing, accompanied by an order signed by the justice of the peace. However, the Medical Examiner shall have the discretion to decline any specific request for autopsy and instead perform an external examination of the body.
 - 2. Written Records. The following records shall accompany the body: (1) the completed form titled "Harris County Medical Examiner Out of County Investigator's Report" (attached hereto and incorporated herein); (2) the entire police report, including scene photographs and; (3) all relevant medical records, including hospital admission and emergency room records, if applicable. Failure to provide all necessary records may result in the Medical Examiner refusing to accept the body for a postmortem examination.
 - 3. Body Bag. Each body transported to the Medical Examiner for a postmortem examination must be enclosed inside a zippered body bag. The body bag shall have the deceased's name affixed to the outside.
- B. <u>Laboratory Analyses</u>. The Medical Examiner shall conduct a postmortem toxicological analysis, if appropriate, and any other tests considered necessary to assist in determining the cause and manner of death and identification.
- C. <u>Testimony</u>. Medical Examiner personnel performing services pursuant to this agreement shall appear as reasonably necessary to provide testimony in a criminal case before a district court of the Requesting County. The Requesting County agrees to use its best efforts to schedule the testimony of the Medical Examiner's personnel in such a manner to cause the least amount of disruption in their work schedule.
- D. <u>Reports</u>. Within a reasonable time after the completion of a postmortem examination, the Medical Examiner will provide a written copy of the autopsy report to the justice of the peace who requested the autopsy.
- E. <u>Transportation</u>. The Requesting County shall have the sole responsibility for transporting the deceased to the Forensic Center. Upon notification by the Medical Examiner that the autopsy

has been completed, the Requesting County shall make arrangements for the deceased to be transported immediately to a funeral home.

- F. <u>Training</u>. The Medical Examiner will conduct an annual training seminar at the Forensic Center in Houston for justices of the peace, their court personnel and other criminal justice officials, including investigators.
- G. No Interment. Harris County shall have no responsibility for burying the remains of the deceased. Consistent with Tex. Health & Safety Code Ann. § 711.002(e), the Requesting County shall have sole responsibility for interment of the body.

III. CONSIDERATION FOR SERVICES

A. <u>Autopsy Fees</u>. In consideration for the services provided by the Medical Examiner, the Requesting County agrees to pay Harris County all costs and expenses associated with performing the autopsy in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Standard Autopsy Examination

\$2,250 per body

(b) External Examination

\$1,000 per body

- B. <u>Special Tests</u>. In addition to the autopsy fee, the Requesting County agrees to pay Harris County for any special tests requested by the Requesting County or deemed appropriate by the Medical Examiner, that are performed by the Harris County Forensic Laboratory or an independent laboratory. These additional charges may include DNA analyses, GSR analysis and trace evidence collection, if required, in accordance with the Fee Schedule attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A."
- C. <u>Testimony</u>. The Requesting County shall additionally pay Harris County for the time spent by the Medical Examiner's pathologists, the Chief Toxicologist, or other personnel providing sworn testimony in connection with a postmortem examination requested by the Requesting County. Testimony fee are in accordance with the Harris County Medical Examiner's Fee Schedule, attached hereto and incorporated herein. These rates shall apply also to pretrial preparation, attendance at pretrial conferences, travel time and any time spent waiting to provide testimony.
- D. Storage of Bodies. The Requesting County shall pay Harris County the additional sum of Forty Five Dollars (\$45) per day for each body that remains at the Forensic Center beyond forty-eight hours after notification by the Medical Examiner that the body is ready to be released to the Requesting County. This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement and shall apply to any bodies currently remaining at the Forensic Center.
- E. <u>Invoice</u>. By the next business day following the first ten (10) days of the subsequent calendar month, Harris County agrees to submit to the Requesting County an invoice requesting payment for the services performed under this Agreement and the final report completed during the preceding calendar month. Such invoice shall include the total number of autopsies performed, the dates the autopsies were performed, and the total amount due for the services performed. The Requesting County shall pay the total amount of the invoice within thirty (30) days of the

date of receipt of the invoice by the Requesting County. If the Requesting County fails to pay any invoice within sixty (60) days after receipt, the Medical Examiner may refuse to accept any additional bodies for autopsy.

- F. <u>Fair Compensation</u>. Harris County and the Requesting County agree and acknowledge that the contractual payments contemplated by this agreement are reasonable and fairly compensate Harris County for the services or functions performed under this Agreement.
- G. <u>Death Certificates</u>. The justice of the peace who requested the postmortem examination be performed shall provide the Medical Examiner with a copy of the signed Certificate of Death immediately upon filing with the local registrar.

IV. FUNDS

- A. <u>Current Funds</u>. The Requesting County agrees and acknowledges that the contractual payments in this Agreement shall be made to Harris County from current revenues available to the Requesting County.
- B. <u>Certified Availability</u>. The Requesting County has available and has specifically allocated \$12,750.00, as evidenced by a certification of funds by the Requesting County's County Auditor. In the event funds certified available by the Requesting County's County Auditor are no longer sufficient to compensate Harris County for the services provided under this Agreement, Harris County shall have no further obligation to complete the performance of any services until the Requesting County certifies sufficient additional current funds. The Requesting County agrees to immediately notify Harris County regarding any additional certification of funds for this Agreement.
- C. Other Statutory Liability. This Agreement is not intended to limit any statutory liability of the Requesting County to pay for services provided by Harris County when the funds certified by the Requesting County are no longer sufficient to compensate Harris County for the services provided under this Agreement.
- D. <u>Overdue Payments</u>. It is understood and agreed that chapter 2251 of the Texas Government Code applies to late payments.

VOL.

V. TERMINATION

- A. <u>Without Notice</u>. If the Requesting County defaults in the payment of any obligation in this Agreement, Harris County is authorized to terminate this Agreement immediately without notice.
- B. With Notice. It is understood and agreed that either party may terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of the term set forth above, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. By the next business day following the first ten (10) days of the subsequent calendar month after the effective date of such termination, Harris County will submit an invoice showing the amounts due for the month in which termination occurs in the manner set out above for submitting monthly invoices.

VI. NOTICE

Any notice required to be given under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be duly served when it shall have been deposited, enclosed in a wrapper with the proper postage prepaid thereon, and duly registered or certified, return receipt requested, in a United States Post Office, addressed to the parties at the following addresses:

VII. MERGER

The parties agree that this Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions of the understanding of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. All prior negotiations, discussions, correspondence and preliminary understandings between the parties and others relating hereto are superseded by this Agreement.

VIII. VENUE

Exclusive venue for any action arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be in Harris County, Texas.

IX. MISCELLANEOUS

This instrument contains the entire Agreement between the parties relating to the rights granted and the obligations assumed. Any oral or written representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force and effect excepting a subsequent modification in writing signed by both parties. This Agreement may be executed in duplicate counterparts, each having equal force and effect of an original. This Agreement shall become binding and effective only after it has been authorized and approved by both counties, as evidenced by the signature of the appropriate authority pursuant to an order of the Commissioners Court of the respective County authorizing such execution.
