

Northeast Texas Beaver and Feral Hog Management Program Joint Resolution

Whereas, in Northeast Texas most large reservoirs, private lakes, and U.S. Army Corp of Engineers and U.S. Soil Conservation lakes have been constructed to provide water supply and recreational opportunities for hundreds of thousands of residents and visitors; and

Whereas, beavers, a non-native Texas species, were introduced in Northeast Texas by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department as late as 1973; and

Whereas, feral hogs are also a non-native Texas species, introduced to the area through a combination of accidental releases and intentional stockings; and

Whereas, feral hogs are prolific breeders, sometimes one hog producing up to 24 offspring in a single year. The beaver population has also changed to where they have shorter gestational periods; and

Whereas, the increase in suitable habitat coupled with the species' reproductive patterns results in a surge in the population of these species in the 35 county Northeast Texas region (Bowie, Cass, Delta, Franklin, Hopkins, Lamar, Morris, Red River, Titus, Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity, Tyler, Anderson, Camp, Cherokee, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson, Marion, Panola, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt and Wood); and

Whereas, local government officials in Northeast Texas have witnessed with increasing frequency property damage to roads, bridges, culverts, stock tanks, and lakes along with significant agricultural damage resulting from the beaver introduction and the current surge of the population of destructive feral hogs. This damage can be especially dangerous to the state's agriculture production, potentially costing the Texas economy millions of dollars in losses; and

Whereas, feral hogs carry lethal diseases that can be transmitted to humans; and

Whereas, feral hog activity is increasing along the state's highway system; at least two recent highway deaths in Navarro County and Wood County are attributed to feral hogs; and

Whereas, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Texas A&M Cooperative Extension Service and Cooperative Extension Program Wildlife Services Unit are the cooperating agencies in Texas to alleviate or mitigate damage caused by various wildlife species; and

Whereas, the State's allocation to address the problem for the 2006-2007 biennium is inadequate to reduce the numbers of beavers and feral hogs in Northeast Texas. The total funding for wildlife control for the entire state is \$3 million per year; and

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved That, additional manpower and equipment are desperately needed to alleviate the magnitude of beaver and feral hog destruction occurring in Northeast Texas, with the potential to spread to urban areas;

Be It Further Resolved That, the East Texas Council of Governments, Deep East Texas Council of Governments, and the Ark-Tex Council of Governments requests and encourages the Northeast Texas State Legislative Delegation to provide additional manpower and equipment to the Wildlife Services Unit for the 2008-2009 biennium period for the expressed purpose of beaver and feral hog management control in the 35 county Northeast Texas region. Specifically, it is requested that an additional \$4.5 million be directed to the Northeast Texas region to hire 20 dual role wildlife specialists, furnish the necessary equipment, provide per diem and fuel costs, and administrative costs for a two year period.

AMENDED RESOLUTION EXPRESSING INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES TO BE INCURRED BY POLK COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, Polk County, Texas (the "Issuer") is a Texas County and a political subdivision of the State of Texas authorized to issue obligations to finance its activities pursuant to various Texas statutes, including anticipation notes pursuant to Chapter 1431, Texas Government Code, the interest on which is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes ("tax-exempt obligations") pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code");

WHEREAS, the Issuer has previously made a resolution to authorize the reimbursement of certain expenditure on September 12, 2006 which authorized the reimbursement of \$1,000,000 from its General Fund and \$1,000,000 from its Road and Bridge Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer finds that the costs associated with its projected expenditures will exceed the \$1,000,000 for the expenditures to be paid from the General Fund, and that it currently has \$75,521.63 remaining from such original amount set forth in such resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer finds that it should increase the amount projected for reimbursement from the General Fund by an additional \$500,000 to cover future expenditures before it issues obligations to reimburse itself from such funds; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer finds that it will make, or has made not more than 60 days prior to the date of the original resolution or the date hereof for the increased amount of the General Fund portion, payments from funds from interfund transfers, as authorized by Section 1431.005, Texas Government Code, with respect to the acquisition, construction and improvements to the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto:

WHEREAS, the Issuer has concluded that it does not currently desire to issue tax-exempt obligations to finance the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto:

WHEREAS, the Issuer desires to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which it funded from interfund transfers, from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof; and,

WHEREAS, the Issuer reasonably expects to issue tax-exempt obligations to reimburse itself for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The Issuer reasonably expects to reimburse itself for all costs that have been or will be paid subsequent to the date that is 60 days prior to the date of the original resolution and 60 days prior to the date hereof for this Resolution and that are to be paid in connection with the acquisition, construction and improvements to the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto from the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued subsequent to the date hereof.
- <u>Section 2</u>. This Resolution is also made to evidence the intent of the Issuer to make such reimbursements under Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2 and Section 1201.042, Texas Government Code.
- **Section 3.** <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The findings and preambles set forth in this Resolution are hereby incorporated into this Resolution and made a part hereof for all purposes.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The Issuer reasonably expects that the maximum principal amount of tax-exempt obligations issued to reimburse the Issuer for the costs associated with the projects listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto will not exceed \$2,500,000.

PURPOSE

This directive in intending to reaffirm this Department's commitment to unbiased policing, to clarify the circumstances in which officers can consider race / ethnicity when making law enforcement decisions, and to reinforce procedures that serve to assure the public we are proving and enforcing laws in equitable way.

I. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS AND GUIDELINES:

This Department is committed to protecting the constitutional and civil rights of all citizens. Allegations of "racial profiling" (as defined herein) or discriminatory practices, real or perceived, are detrimental to the relationship between police and the communities they protect and serve, because they strike at the basic foundation of public trust. This trust is essential to effective community based policing. Racially biased policing is an ineffective method of law enforcement and often results in increased safety risks to officers and citizens and the misuse of valuable police resources. Additionally, improper racially biased policing violates the civil rights of members of the public and may lead to increased exposure to liability. This Department does not endorse, train, teach, support, or condone any racially biased policing by its officers. While recognizing that most officers perform their duties in a professional, ethical and impartial manner, this Department is committed to identifying and eliminating any instances of racially biased policing. (Racial Profiling)

II. MISSION STATEMENT

- a. It is the policy of the Department to:
 - 1. Provide all people within this community fair and impartial police services consistent with constitutional and statutory mandates;
 - 2. Assure the highest standard of integrity and ethics among all our members;
 - 3. Respect the diversity and cultural differences of all people;
 - 4. Take positive steps to identify, prevent, and eliminate any instances of racially biased policing by our members;
 - Continue our commitment to community policing and problem solving, including vigorous, lawful, and non-discriminatory traffic enforcement that promotes public safety and strengthens public trust, confidence, and awareness;
 - 6. To patrol in a pro-active manner, aggressively investigating suspicious persons and circumstances, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe that they have committed, are committing, or about to commit, an infraction of the law.

III. DEFINITIONS

- a. Racial Profiling
 - "Racial Profiling" means a law enforcement- initiated action based on an individuals race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity. (Texas Code Criminal Procedure, Article 3.05)
 - "Race or Ethnicity" means a particular descent, including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American descent. (Texas Code of Criminal Procedure. Article 2.132 (a)

IV. POLICY

- a. Policing impartially
 - Investigative detentions, traffic stops, arrests, searches, and property seizures by officers will be based on a standard of reasonable suspicion or probable cause in accordance with the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution. Officers must be able to articulate specific facts and circumstances that support reasonable suspicion or probable cause for investigative detentions, traffic stops, arrest, non – consensual searches, and property seizures.

Except as provided below, officers shall not consider race, ethnicity, or national origin in establishing either reasonable suspicion or probable cause. Similarly, except as provided below, officers shall not consider race, ethnicity, or national origin in deciding to initiate even those nonconsensual encounters that do not amount to legal detentions or to request consent to search.

Officers may take into account the reported race, ethnicity, or national origin of a specific suspect or suspects based on trustworthy, locally relevant information that links a person or persons of a specific race, ethnicity, or national origin to particular unlawful incident(s). Race, ethnicity, or national origin can never be used as the sole basis for probable cause or reasonable suspicion.

- 2. Except when provided above, race ethnicity, or national origin, should not be motivating factors in making law enforcement decisions.
- b. Preventing perceptions of biased policing
 - In an effort to prevent inappropriate perceptions of biased law enforcement, each officer should undertake to do the following when conducting pedestrian or vehicle stops
 - a) Be courteous and professional
 - b) Introduce him/herself to the citizen and state the reason for the stop as soon as practical, unless providing this information will

- compromise officer or public safety. In vehicle stops, the officer shall provide this information before asking the driver for his/her license and registration.
- c) Ensure that the detention is no longer than necessary to take appropriate action for the known or suspected offense, and that the citizen understands the purpose of the reasonable delays.
- d) Answer any questions the citizen may have, including explaining options for traffic citation disposition, if relevant.
- e) Provide his/her name and badge number when requested.
- f) Apologize and/or explain if he/she determines that the reasonable suspicion was unfounded. (i.e., after an investigatory stop).

V. PREVENTION OF RACIALLY BIASED POLICING (RACIAL PROFILING) AND THE PERCEPTIONS THEREOF

- To prevent racially biased policing (racial profiling) perceptions thereof, this Department shall:
 - Utilize the departmental, regional, or state training programs to help ensure that appropriate employees receive training addressing racially biased policing and the standards established by this written directive;
 - Ensure that this written directive is disseminated to all officers, communications employees, and other appropriate personnel within the department;
 - Train supervisory personnel to monitor police conduct to ensure that the standards of this written directive are being carried out by employees under their supervision;
 - 4) Review, and, where appropriate, revise procedures or directives that involve the stop, detention, apprehension, or search of individuals to ensure that such procedures or directives are in compliance with provisions of the law and this written directive;
 - Review performance recognition and evaluation systems, training curriculum, policies and customs of the department to determine if any practice encourages conduct that may support or lead to racially biased policing;
 - 6) Provide public education on what to expect when either stopped or detained by a police officer, as well as police expectations during motor vehicle stops or police detainment, to ensure both officer and citizen safety; and
 - 7) Educate the public regarding the departments procedures relating to the filing of complaints by individuals who may feel they have been the subject of racially biased policing.

VI. MOBILE VIDEO / AUDIO RECORDING

 Every officer utilizing a departmental motor vehicle equipped with either video and audio equipment, shall;

- Record each traffic and pedestrian stop made by the officer that is capable of being
 recorded by video or audio equipment, as appropriate, by activating the recording
 equipment prior to the stop, recording the behavior of the vehicle and/ or the person,
 and recording until such time as the person is released or, if arrested, placed in a
 custodial facility.
- a. If a complaint is filed with the department alleging that an officer has engaged in Racially biased policing with respect to traffic or pedestrian stop, the video and audio or audio record of the stop shall be retained until final disposition of the complaint.

VII. IDENTIFICATION OF RACIALLY BIASED POLICING

- a. All supervisors shall be responsible for the pro-active review of the performance of personnel they supervise to assist in identifying and modifying potentially problematic behavior and to promote professionalism in this department.
- b. The designated supervisor shall meet, as required or requested by a particular group member, with members of groups effected by this policy.
- c. Community relationships are "two-way streets" and for the police-minority relationships to work, minority groups must do more than just verbalize concerns or complaints. Accordingly, the community liaison shall encourage minority community members to become involved by:
 - Engaging in dialogue about solutions rather than blame;
 - 2. Developing a broad understanding of police practices on the part of minority community members in order to encourage them to form an objective standard by which to judge police actions;
 - Acknowledging police officers that promote positive police-community relations with awards or other commendations.
- d. The designated community liaison shall facilitate the distribution of public educational materials relating to the departments complaint process.
- e. The designated community liaison may utilize department personnel, as appropriate, to assist in meeting the community outreach goals.

IX. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- a. Officers initiating traffic stops in which a citation is issued or in which an arrest results from that traffic stop, will be responsible for:
 - Ensuring the accurate completion of any traffic citation issued, specifically
 providing information in regard to the race or ethnicity of the individual
 detained. If a search is conducted, the box next to "search" on the citation
 is to be checked. If the person detained gave consent for the search, the box
 next to "consent" shall be checked. The officer should note on the reverse
 side of the ticket, in the notes section, any additional relevant information
 such as any contraband or evidence found during the search, was the search
 incident to arrest, etc.
 - Unlike age and gender, which appear on an individual driver's license, discerning race or ethnicity requires a verbal inquiry of the individual or an officer's subjecting determination. Since a verbal inquiry risks exacerbating tensions during a potentially tense encounter, to minimize

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inconvenience and maximize officer safety, the officer's perception of race or ethnicity will be used.

- 3. To indicate the race / ethnicity of a person receiving a citation or being arrested, the following letter codes will be used on the citation:
 - C Caucasian
 - A African
 - H Hispanic (Latino)
 - AS Asian
 - N Native American
 - O Other

X. COMPLAINT OF RACIALLY BIASED POLICING

a. Who may file:

Any person may file a complaint with the department if they feel they have been stopped or searched based on that individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather that on that individual's behavior or information identifying them as having engaged in criminal activity. No person shall be discouraged, intimidated, or coerced from filing such a complaint or discriminated against because they have filed such a complaint.

- b. If an officer on the street is approached by a citizen regarding a complaint alleged racially biased policing, the officer being approached should inform the citizen that his / her complaint should be directed to a supervisor at the sheriffs department.
- c. Supervisors receiving a citizen's complaint shall determine, if possible, whether the complainant wishes to have the complaint considered as a formal complaint or informal complaint.
- d. If the complainant wishes to have the complaint considered on an "informal" basis, the supervisor shall take such action as is appropriate based on the complaint and all attendant circumstances. Upon resolving the "informal" complaint, the supervisor will forward the citizens complaint, accompanied by a report or document describing the action of the supervisor took in regard to the complaint, to the sheriff.
- e. If a supervisor determines that the citizen wishes their complaint to be classed, as a "formal" complaint the supervisor should take a written statement from the citizen. The statement along with the signed "complaint against officer" shall be forwarded to the sheriff for other investigative actions.

f. Telephone Complaints

- Citizens making a complaint by telephone should be informed that their signed complaint is requested; however, no telephone complaint should be refused or rejected because the complainant does not wish to sign a complaint form or because she or he does not wish to be identified.
- 2. If the citizen declines to complete the written complaint form. The supervisor receiving the telephone complaint should attempt to determine all relevant information as required on the complaint and report form and record that information on the form.

XL ENFORCEMENT OF THIS DIRECTIVE

- a. To enforce the provisions of this directive, this department shall:
 - 1. Take appropriate action to address documented incidents of racially biased policing;
 - Utilize a system of intervention to enable or encourage an officer to undertake voluntary modifications of his or her conduct or performance; and
 - 3. Take appropriate measures to correct any institutional practice or policy that has led to racially biased policing.

XII OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO OTHER AGENCIES

a. Officers of this department assigned to or assisting other law enforcement agencies will be guided by this written directive.

XIII. APPLICATION

- a. This Written directive is not intended to enlarge an employee's civil or liability in any way. It shall not be considered as a creation of a higher legal standard of safety or care in an evidentiary sense with respect to third party claims insofar as the employee's legal duties imposed by law.
- b. Any data collected as a result of reporting requirements pursuant to Article 2.131 through 2.138 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, as implemented by the written directive, shall not be considered prima facie evidence of racially biased policing (racial profiling).
- c. The Department is not liable for damages arising from any act relating to the collection or reporting of information as required pursuant to Article 2.131 through 2.138 or under this policy adopted pursuant to Article 2.132 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.
- d. Audio or videotapes prepared pursuant to this directive shall be reviewed, as necessary, to implement the purpose and requirements of this written directive.

IN SUPPORT OF PASSAGE OF SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 45

WHEREAS, Senate Joint Resolution 45 has been introduced for consideration by the Legislature of the State of Texas, proposing an amendment to Section 47, Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the said amendment is proposed to allow the legislature to authorize the operation of limited casino gaming and video lottery games by recognized Indian tribes and others, upon the creation of a Commission regulating gaming and casino-based development projects in the State of Texas, with gaming revenues designated to pay tuition and fees for the post secondary education of Texas high school graduates as administered by a higher education trust fund; and

WHEREAS, the said amendment proposes licensing of twelve casino-anchored destination attraction development projects within the State of Texas, to-wit: seven of which for urban areas, as allocated by population, each said development to include total land and development costs of at least \$400 million; two of which on islands in the Gulf of Mexico, each said development to include total land and development costs of at least \$200 million; and three additional projects at locations determined by the proposed Texas Gaming Commission to achieve targeted economic development or permanent new job creation, each said project to include total land and development costs of at least \$150 million;

WHEREAS, the Alabama Coushatta Tribe of Texas is a federally-recognized Indian tribe located in Livingston, Polk County, Texas, and is committed to supporting the passage of State legislation to establish gaming on tribal lands, and the said Alabama Coushatta Tribe of Texas has endorsed the said establishment of gaming as a positive economic development which will allow the citizens and businesses of Southeast Texas the opportunity to prosper through the growth and development within the region; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Texas Constitution will require approval at a general election held for its consideration by the voters of the State of Texas; and further be subject to approval of the voters of Polk County upon application for license for a casino-anchored destination attraction development project to be located in Polk County; and

WHEREAS, promotion of economic development, if so approved by the voters of the State of Texas and voters of Polk County, will be beneficial to Polk County;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF POLK COUNTY, TEXAS:

That Polk County, Texas hereby joins the Alabama Coushatta Tribe of Texas in its support of passage of Senate Joint Resolution 45.

ORDER FOR ELECTION TO ADOPT AN AD VALOREM TAX AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 1-a, ARTICLE VIII OF THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION

On this the $13^{2/2}$ day of March, 2007 came for consideration the matter of setting an election for the adoption of an ad valorem tax as provided by section 1-a, Article VIII of the Texas Constitution. The County may impose a tax for the construction and maintenance of farm-to-market and lateral roads or for flood control. TEX. CONST. art. VIII, § 1-a; TEX. TRANSP. Code §256.054(a). The County is authorized to tax all property within its boundary, "except the first Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000) value of residential homesteads of married or unmarried adults, ..., not to exceed thirty cents (30¢) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation." TEX. CONST. art. VIII, § 1-a.

The Commissioners Court may order an election for the adoption of this tax on its own motion. Tex. Transp. Code §256.054(b). The proposition to be submitted to the voters will provide that the tax may be used for the construction and maintenance of farm-tomarket and lateral roads as determined by the Commissioners Court. See TEX. TRANSP. Code §256.054(c). "The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: 'Adopting a farm-to-market and lateral roads tax not exceeding 5 cents on each \$100 valuation." TEX. TRANSP. Code §256.054(c).

Based on the above, the Court orders an election be held on May 12, 2007 for the stated proposition on adoption of the farm-to-market and lateral roads tax.
