AUTHORIZING SUPPORT FOR PASSAGE OF STATE LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING REFUNDABLE DEPOSITS ON ALUMINUM, GLASS & PLASTIC BEVERAGE CONTAINERS SOLD IN THE STATE OF TEXAS

WHEREAS, beverage containers and packaging make up approximately 31% of the waste stream nationally; and

WHEREAS, beverage container waste is a major source of pollution on county roadways and waterways, with taxpayers bearing the brunt of the cleanup cost; and

WHEREAS, refundable deposits provide consumers with an financial incentive to recycle beverage containers; and

WHEREAS, refundable deposits complement existing curbside and other local recycling programs and increase recycling rates; and

WHEREAS, properly designed refundable deposit systems create job growth in the collection, hauling, processing and remanufacturing of recyclable materials; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Polk County Commissioners Court hereby offers this resolution as demonstrated by our official signatures below in support of state legislation to establish a recycling refund system for beverage containers.
