Designating Surplus/Salvage Property to be Donated to
Indian Springs, Holiday Lake Estates, Scenic Loop, Segno, South Polk County, Alabama-
Coushatta, Goodrich, Corrigan, Livingston and Onalaska Volunteer Fire Departments


WHEREAS, in a regular meeting of the Polk County Commissioners Court held September 11, 2018, those items listed on "Exhibit A", were determined to be surplus property as defined by Local Government Code, Chapter 263 Subchapter D, Section 263.151, consisting of 10 Panasonic Toughbook's and 6 HP Mobile Printers purchased through TCEQ LEPC Grant, as listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

FURTHERMORE, pursuant to Local Government Code, Section 263.152(a)(4), The commissioners court finds that the Volunteer Fire Departments are qualified organizations to which the County may donate the property and the Court finds that: (A) undertaking to sell the property would likely result in no bids or a bid price that is less than the county's expenses required for the bid process; (B) the donation serves a public purpose; and (C) the receiving organizations will provide the county with adequate consideration;

THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED, that the Commissioners Court approves the donation of the property listed on Exhibit A attached hereto to the Indian Springs, Holiday Lake Estates, Scenic Loop, Segno and South Polk County, Alabama-Coushatta, Goodrich, Corrigan, Livingston and Onalaska Volunteer Fire Departments for use at the respected Fire Departments.

FURTHER, Polk County recognizes that the transport and proper installation of the donated computers and printers is the sole responsibility of the Volunteer Fire Department.
