## Authorizing Commissioners to Place Road Signs on Private Roadways

WHEREAS. the County of Po

the County of Polk is given the responsibility/authority in Chapter

771, Health and Safety Code to provide 9-1-1 services and assign

addresses; and

WHEREAS, the 9-1-1 Program assigns addresses to property on all public and

private roadways to assist emergency responders; and

WHEREAS, roads that are not maintained by the County might not have visible

street signs posted at all intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Polk County Commissioners Court finds it in the best interest of

the citizens of Polk County to provide assistance to emergency first

responders in locating all public and private roadways.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County of Polk does hereby authorize the Road & Bridge Commissioners, at their discretion, to place road signs on private roadways within their Precincts to protect the public safety and provide assistance to emergency responders.

## ATTENTION COMMISSIONERS COURT MEMBERS:

The Texas Open Meetings Act permits the exchange of information between members of a governmental body. However, our intent is to avoid any confusion concerning the difference between an exchange of information and a "deliberation" by a quorum under the Act. Since a "Reply All" response to this email could have the potential to result in an inadvertent violation of the Act, please reply only to the Sender.

Commissioners: The 911 program assigns addresses to property on private roads to assist emergency responders. Since Article III, Section 52, Texas Constitution requires a public purpose for all county expenditures, it is recommended that the commissioners court adopt a written policy on the public benefit of road signs on private roads before installing them. There is no special requirement, and a simple resolution or motion to authorize the placement of road signs on private roads to protect the public safety and provide assistance to emergency responders is sufficient. However, it is also recommended that the county obtain approval from the person or entity that controls the property where the sign will be placed. This may be TXDOT where the private road intersects with a state highway or a homeowners association or a private individual. A simple written request for placement of the sign will be sufficient. Finally, since this is a discretionary service, the county may require a donation to partially or fully reimburse for the cost by including this provision in the county policy. However, this may defeat the intended purpose of assisting emergency responders if the property owner does not participate. Jim Allison
