The County will provide notice to the WSC at least 30 days prior to the bidding of construction which will be open for at least 30 days.

The WSC will supply the County with the 25% match requirement as their commitment to proceed with the Project at time of bid approval by the Polk County Commissioners Court.

The WSC will provide the County with back up documentation of the 25% match payment (canceled checks or EFT) and any other required financial documentation within thirty (30) days of payment to the County.

The County will be responsible for all procurement associated with the Project to include engineering services for Project development/design/ and construction management, and grant administration services for overall compliance and reporting with ARPA guidelines.

The WSC hereby authorizes the County to enter into contracts with engineers, contractors, consultants and other service providers as necessary for the Project.

The County will submit invoices and canceled checks to a consultant hired to manage the grant projects (Consultant). The Consultant shall provide any and all documents (cleared checks, bank statements, expense ledgers, receipts, etc.) showing that funds have been spent for the requested purpose quarterly. Documentation should be provided by April 5, July 5, Oct 5, and Jan 5 until all funds are spent, and must comply with all Federal and State laws and legislation.

The WSC acknowledges that the County is not financially responsible for the Project, nor will the County be liable for any future claims or damages that may result from the Project. The County is named on the Project only until the grant period closes, December 31, 2026.

The WSC will be responsible for maintaining the project, monthly, quarterly, and annually according to the approved maintenance agreement (Attachment B)

It is understood that the WSC remains responsible for the Water Infrastructure Project throughout the grant period, through the full audit period and for the life of the project.
